

Latest update from BT 30/03/17

All,

After a long silence I had a final update from Wiltshire Online on the installation of faster broadband.

The bad news is that this only applies to part of the village.

The Ivies, Dragon Lane, Primrose Lane and the road from the village hall up to Primrose and **part** of the C52 are included.

One important factor is that your phone number needs to be on Cabinet 2 in the Pewsey exchange. You can find that out by checking here:

Openreach is still exploring other options for Abbots and houses across from the railway going up to Prospect.

You might have noticed planning application leaflets on some of the BT telephone poles.

This morning I received the below from Wiltshire Online.

From Wiltshire Online:

"Thank you for contacting Wiltshire Online.

I can advise that you are currently served by Cabinet 2, Pewsey exchange which has been upgraded to fibre as part of the Wiltshire Online programme; unfortunately your premises are too far to benefit.

The good news is that we are planning on picking up your premises as part of our Phase 2 rollout with a Fibre to the Premises (FTTP) solution. The proposed solution has successfully passed the planning stage and is now with Openreach's contractors to build. In order to bring fibre into your community, the contractors will need to provide an overhead fibre connection along the existing poles of

approximately 3km and this work is due to start soon. Whilst I cannot at this stage advise of a go-live date, Openreach are aiming for a Q1 delivery (April – June 2017).

I note that you have registered your details with our 'When Can I Get It' service which means that one of our team will email you when the new structure is live and accepting fibre orders."
